INSTRUCTIONAL RESOURCES AND MATERIALS

Supplies

All students in the elementary (K-8) schools will have required textbooks and supplies furnished by the District.

The Governing Board shall furnish free required textbooks and related printed subject matter materials for high school students in grades nine (9) through twelve (12).

"Textbook" means printed and/or digital instructional materials, or both, and related printed or nonprinted instructional materials, that are written and published primarily for use in school instruction and that are available for use by pupils in the classroom, including materials that require the availability of electronic equipment in order to be used as a learning resource.

Students and their parents shall be held responsible for proper care of books and school property. Books must be kept clean and unmarked. Parents may be required to pay for any damage to school property.

The Superintendent is authorized to establish a replacement-fee schedule and make it available to students, staff members, and parents. Students and parents will be advised of this replacement-cost policy upon enrollment or at the beginning of each school year.

Access to Instructional Material by Parents and Guardians

The Superintendent shall establish procedures that permit parents or guardians of students enrolled in the District access to the instructional materials currently used by, or being considered for use by, the District in accordance with the terms of this policy. A parent who objects to any learning material or activity may request an alternative assignment.
